## SUPPORT FOR AMTRAK IS STILL NEEDED

## OARP ANNUAL MEETING IS MAY 18th

## **OPTIONS for OHIO**

The past two months have been extremely busy ones for OARP legislative activities. A top priority for us right now is to try to establish the new Ohio 3-C Corridor Amtrak rail passenger service, between Cleveland-Columbus-Cincinnati, with the help of the Celeste Administration and the new 116th General Assembly in the Statehouse. While we are still extremely disappointed that the funding for the 3-C Amtrak service was

extremely disappointed that the funding for the 3-C Amtrak service was not included in Governor Celeste's proposed biennial budget, OARP remains undaunted and we are very actively pursuing other means of action. We have discovered, though, that the Governor's office, per se, is not opposed to the 3-C Corridor funding of approximately \$6.7 million for the biennium; but chose, for political reasons, not to include any new projects in the Governor's budget which was submitted for Ohio House and Senate approval.

Most of us already know that the Republican leadership of the Senate voted on April 4th to essentially endorse President Reagan's (and David Stockman's) proposed budget with zero funding for Amtrak; effective wit the beginning of the next federal fiscal year on October 1, 1985. only opportunity we as OARP members and Amtrak riders/supporters have to influence the outcome of the full Senate vote is to communicate with members of the full Senate and members of the Senate Appropriations Com-The two U.S. Senators from Ohio, JOHN GLENN and HOWARD METZEN-BAUM, have somewhat opposing profiles concerning Amtrak at the moment. As we see it...  $_{\scriptsize HOWARD}$  METZENBAUM has consistently voted in favor of continued Amtrak funding and has spoken out in behalf of Amtrak at various committee meetings, most recently during the televised (C-SPAN) Commerce Committee hearings on March 7th. According to the Senator's staff person for rail matters, Dick Woodruff, Senator METZENBAUM will vote against any attempts to eliminate Amtrak. However, this does not mean that the passenger rail corporation will receive its full requested funding. Very likely the next year's funding may remain at a \$684 million "freeze" level. OARP has received a letter from Senator METZ-ENBAUM in support of continued Amtrak funding. Senator JOHN GLENN, on the other hand, does not serve on any committees dealing directly with Amtrak or any other railroad matters. From his recent letters to OARP members, JOHN GLENN does not seem at all convinced that Amtrak is needed! GLENN is a powerful member of the U.S. Senate and his support is needed! Letters of support and letters of education need to be sent to Senator JOHN GLENN  $\underline{\text{now}}$ ! If possible, PHONE the Senator's Ohio office in Columbus at  $614\overline{-469}$ -6697! Again, time is of the essence!

As to the U.S. House of Representatives, we have clearly identified Congressman JOHN R. KASICH (R-12) as being very negative on Amtrak. His letters to constituents clearly display a lack of facts. OARP members in the 12th Congressional District MUST work on Mr. Kasich and also encourage others to contact him also. We need his support for Amtrak, not against it, as he stands now.

For the first time since 1981, the House is letting the Republican Senate majority "work" the Federal Budget for FY 1986-87. Democratic strategy this time is for the Republicans to do all the posturing and headlining about cuts and program eliminations which will prove to be very unpopular with many of their constituents. The non-binding Senate Republican leadership - Reagan Administration compromise of early April will be quickly overshadowed by attempts of the full Senate to develop a budget resolution which could be voted upon. It is just as likely,

however, that within the next few months no agreement can be reached and that the final Senate decisions will be left up to the mighty Committee on Appropriations. However, because of the strong Amtrak supporters serving on that Committee, it is not probable (according to Dick Woodruff of Sen. Metzenbaum's office) that any drastic cuts will affect Amtrak. House concurrence with any full Senate vote is not going to happen either, so some cuts will likely be restored or elimin-

ated there.

It appears to OARP at this stage that Amtrak will survive, but not without active support from us, the passengers. What will be the cost to Amtrak? Likely not too much, considering all the negative publicity the Republican leadership and Administration has generated for it. Solid support does seem to be there when it's needed. It appears to us that the Amtrak budget will probably stay around a "freeze" amount of \$684 million. Our thanks also to Greg Means from Cong. Eckart's office for information on the Amtrak situation.

houses to introduce an OARP-written budget amendment and appropriation at the right time during the budgeting process between now and approximately June 30th. We have already developed such Ohio enabling legislation for Amtrak - State contracted service which has been received favorably by most legislators who have had a chance to review it. Powerful House leader C. J. McLin (D-36th) has already offered to sponsor this legislation and we are very grateful to him for his offer. ially heartening to us as we wade through the legislative quagmire of political vs. practical action considerations for new 3-C service, is that we do seem to have friends and supporters in the Legislature. We are beginning to develop a coalition of support for the 3-C Corridor! We could not have proceeded as well as we have without the help of one very willing individual, Ron Good of The Sierra Club. Thanks to OARP's Howard Harding and his involvement with The Sierra Club, their executive committee voted to assist us legislatively with the 3-C project by asking their full-time lobbyist to be available with help and support. We are very much indebted to Ron Good as we continue out 3-C activities. The question about the constitutionality of Amtrak 403(b) service in Ohio still keeps coming up from the Ohio Attorney General's office. It IS a complicated issue, yet we see no reason that Ohio cannot find a solution for this... if it really wants to, since most of the other states operating Amtrak 403(b) services have almost identical constitutional language. The issue MUST be resolved. OARP member, attorney Ben Farah of Cleveland has offered to assist us. We'll keep you posted about further activities in the May issue of the 6:53.

OARP is working on an Ohio House—Senate joint resolution in support of Amtrak. We understand Indiana and New York recently passed supportive legislation.

JOE TAYLOR and BILL GLASSER three thir-

ty second radio public service announcements (PSA's) have been produced for OARP and are right now being distributed with a cover letter from OARP's President to 72 Ohio radio stations. We'll play all three PSA's for you at OARP's Annual Meeting in May, and in the meantime you may just hear one of our spots on your favorite radio station. The spots stress the benefits of modern passenger trains and that Ohioans could enjoy additional Amtrak services; and that one way to help achieve this is to write to OARP. The actual sounds of Amtrak's CARDINAL whistling into Hamilton, Ohio, is featured on each of the radio spots. Thanks to OARP's DAVE MARSHALL of Springfield for recording the train sounds!

SURPRISE AT LIMA! Early in March, Amtrak pulled a surprisingly positive move by ADDING a ticket agent job at

the Lima station. This now means that, in addition to the ticket office being staffed daily for both trains, the agency will be open during the daytime on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays. This move is on an experimental basis, for a four-month period, and OARP understands that Lima station revenues during that period must meet an increased monthly quota or the ticket office will be closed completely and Lima would then become a regular, but unmanned stop on the BROADWAY/CAPITOL route. OARP encourages members to buy their tickets at Lima's Amtrak Station, if at all possible, to help boost revenues there and assure that the agency will be kept open to better serve ALL Amtrak passengers who ride to and from Lima, Ohio.




